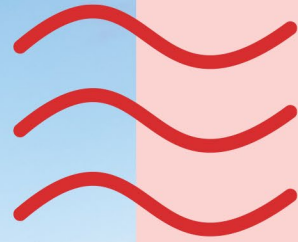

# CAP iwi membership

- On 10 December 2020, Council endorsed the recommendations on the preferred process for the establishment of a CAP for the Takutai Kāpiti project.
- In line with feedback from Te Whakaminenga o Kāpiti, these recommendations included:
  - the CAP membership will comprise of 6 iwi representatives.
  - the recognised iwi authorities will provide recommendations for the CAP iwi representative appointments.

# CAP iwi membership

- To enable a CAP start date in May/ June 2021, we would like to work with iwi at their earliest availability to:
  - begin the process for iwi representative recommendations and appointments.
  - determine how the representatives will work in practice during the process to ensure the collective environmental vision, values and position inherited and held by the iwi of Kāpiti are represented on the CAP.
- W/C 22 March 2021 – letter to be circulated to iwi regarding these matters.



# CAP meeting arrangement and remuneration

## Meeting arrangements

- The CAP will meet for a period of 12 months from mid-2021.
- This includes monthly workshops (3hr), one site visit (3hr) and public open days (for each Kāpiti Coast District Ward).
- Online process (with the exception of the site visit and open days).
- Weeknight workshops.

## Remuneration

- CAP members will receive a set sum per meeting/ open day attendance of: \$206.00.
- Reimbursement of expenses would be paid in addition to the daily fee.



# Cultural Values Assessment

- The majority of our Kāpiti Tangata Whenua communities live along the coastline.
- Climate change impacts on our coast has the potential to damage ancestral lands, sites of cultural significance and the wellbeing and protection of our Tangata Whenua.
- Economic, social, spiritual and cultural considerations are as important as the physical science when making informed decisions on coastal adaptation.

# Cultural Values Assessment

- KCDC wish to commission a Cultural Values Assessment for the Kāpiti Coast from Ngāti Toa Rangatira, Ngā Hapū o Ōtaki and Te Atiawa ki Whakarongotai.

## Anticipated process

- A lead author is assigned to facilitate the Assessment and collate all three iwi input and knowledge.
- One key author for each iwi that can report directly to the lead author/ facilitator.
- The iwi authors can also hold the wānanga with their iwi to go through the draft document (i.e. receiving feedback on the draft, identify gaps and limitations, adding oral korero).

- CAP commencement May/ June (recruitment dependant)
